

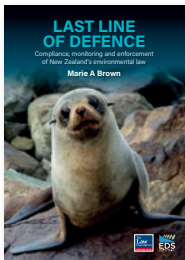


Voices from the Sea

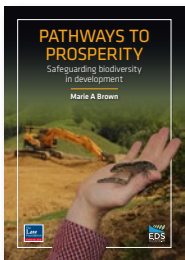


The Story of the HAURAKI GULF

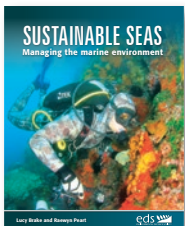


Pathways to Prosperity: safeguarding biodiversity in development

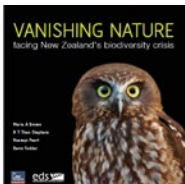


Sustainable Seas: Managing the Marine Environment
